

PHARM D/MSL COORDINATED DEGREE

INFORMATION FOR SUMMER 2020 COHORT

Overview

- The Master of Studies in Law (MSL) degree, with a concentration in Health Law and Compliance, is offered by the Cumberland School of Law (CSL) at Samford University.
- The MSL is accredited by the Compliance Certification Board (CCB)[®]. Graduates of the program
 will be eligible to sit for any of the following credentialing exams offered by the Compliance
 Certification Board: Healthcare Compliance (CHC)[™], Healthcare Research Compliance
 (CHRC)[®], Healthcare Privacy Compliance (CHPC)[®] Compliance and Ethics Professional
 (CCEP)[®].
- Up to 13 credit hours of MSL course work can be fulfilled by PHRX coursework.
- Students do not need to have a BS degree prior to admission to this program but a BS degree is required before completing the MSL program.
- P1 students cannot take any MSL courses during P1 fall or spring semesters.
- Students need a PHRX cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 to apply; GRE / GMAT are not required.
- Students can submit an application to be admitted to this program up to April 1, 2020.

Coursework

- Seven (7) specific MSL 'didactic' courses are to be completed.
- All seven MSL courses are offered online.
- These seven MSL courses are not offered every semester.
- Two MSL courses (MHLP 530 and 550) have to be taken in sequence; the other MSL courses can be taken in any order (i.e., no pre-requisite).
- Pharmacy students are exempt from the following MSL courses:
 - MSLW 525 Principles of Business Law (3 hours)
 - o MHLP 520 Introduction to Healthcare Delivery Systems (3 hours)
 - MSLW 535 Legal Writing and Communications Skills (3 hours)
 - MSLW 600 Master of Studies in Law Capstone (3 hours)
- Students may not earn a grade below "C" in any course to progress in the MSL program. Other
 MSL academic policies apply to students in this program. Please refer to the <u>Grad Law website</u>
 for all of these policies.
- MSL courses not completed before graduating from the MSOP program must be completed within 18 months of graduating from the pharmacy program to receive the MSL degree.
- Pharmacy students no longer interested in completing the MSL program have to communicate with the MSOP Associate Dean for Academic Affairs.

Capstone

 PHRX 500, 550, and 600 Capstone topic must be approved by MSOP facilitator as well as by Cumberland's Director of Graduate Programs. A copy of the written paper and presentation are to be submitted to Cumberland's Director of Graduate Programs upon completion.

Electives

- No elective courses are offered in the MSL program.
- Since PHRX courses can count towards the MSL degree, selected courses within the MSL program can be counted as a PHRX didactic elective course.
- The MSOP Curriculum Committee approved these MHLP courses as PHRX didactic electives:
 - o MHLP 530, MHLP 550 and MHLP 570.
- MSOP students in the MSL program can still enroll in PHRX didactic electives.
